Community Exhibition: FOCUS ON ECONOMIC INEQUALITY

Panel Discussion and Reception: September 2016 (*to be arranged*)

This juried exhibition of high school, amateur, and professional artists will provide an opportunity for artists to share their visual exploration of how they see economic inequality today. This event is part of Stockton University's Economic Inequality Initiative (co-chaired by Carra Leah Hood, Assistant Provost and Associate Professor of Writing, and Oliver Cooke, Associate Professor of Economics) and aims to engage educational institutions and the wider community in discussing, debating, documenting, and exploring the complex causes and consequences of economic inequality in the United States.

Stockton's initiative is part of a national three-year initiative launched by the American Association of State Colleges and Universities in September 2014 and reflects the burgeoning national discourse and research on economic inequality that has emerged since the onset of the Great Recession in 2007 and the associated financial crisis. The initiative involves over twenty colleges and universities across the country. These institutions participate in national conversations about economic inequality and have a role in developing interactive curricula and experiential learning modules and experiences—via multiple mediums and across the disciplines—that allow university and community members to study, discuss, and explore the complex relationships between economic inequality, economic opportunity, social mobility, identity, and public policy.

ELIGIBILITY

High School age students and adult amateur and professional artists. [Amateur status is defined by the following criteria: the artist is not currently showing his/her work, is not represented by a gallery, does not function as a professional career artist and therefore is not paid to produce artistic work, and is not retired from a career as a professional artist.] Entries are limited to 3 artistic pieces per person. All visual media are eligible.

JURORS

Stockton University professors: Oliver Cooke, Prof. of Economics, Carra Leah Hood, Asst. Provost and Prof. of Writing, Michael McGarvey, Prof. of Art, and Kate Nearpass Ogden, Prof. of Art History.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

All artwork must address a theme related to the causes or consequences of economic inequality. All work must have your name, title, and entry number on back. All 2D artwork must be ready to hang with a wire attached. Must provide pedestal or stand for 3D work, if needed.

INSURANCE

All entries are insured for replacement value only from the time of delivery until the designated pickup date. The Atlantic City Art Center assumes no responsibility for works left after the pickup date.
