Amy Cook-Menzel from the Hammonton Community Garden Group will be offering a hands-on activity making plant markers. She will demonstrate a variety of easy design options, utilizing recycled materials to create fun and colorful garden markers. Rocks, beads and wires will be used to make markers, which identify and accessorize plants.

Eleanor Gibson, certified through Rutgers University as an environmental steward and through Organic Land Care as a certified organic nutrition counselor, will speak about the Hammonton Community Garden and how to participate. Gibson actively practiced organic gardening for 25 years when she owned a home with a half-acre yard and regularly explores recipes and fast, easy cooking methods using only organic foods at home.

The Hammonton Community Garden allows brown and green thumbs alike to experience the rewards of gardening in a community setting. Conveniently located at 11th and Washington streets next to the train station, members enjoy organic garden-to-table produce while sharing tips and tricks and monthly lectures on various topics.
