



Addendum A: Dual Degree Program for Business Majors

Transfer Pathways Memorandum of Understanding Between Atlantic Cape Community College and Stockton University

I. Introduction

In March 24, 2020, STOCKTON UNIVERSITY (STOCKTON) and ATLANTIC CAPE COMMUNITY COLLEGE (ATLANTIC CAPE) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to offer multiple opportunities for students to seamlessly pursue Associate's and Bachelor's degrees at two outstanding institutions of higher education.

This Addendum extends this agreement to Dual Degree Programs that offer accelerated routes between undergraduate and graduate programs, an effort which specifically addresses section III.B of the existing MOU, included below:

To build on this system, STOCKTON and ATLANTIC CAPE agree to develop specific program-to-program articulation agreements for high-demand majors to facilitate the quality and ease of transfer of students into comparable academic majors. Such agreements will be appended to this MOU and reviewed regularly by both schools to ensure they remain up-to-date in terms of course descriptions and degree requirements.

All aspects of the current Transfer Pathways agreement outlined in sections I through XIV remain in effect.

II. Accelerated Dual Degree Program for Business Majors

STOCKTON's Accelerated Dual Degree Program for Business Majors, a 2+3 program, allows students to complete their undergraduate degree and a Master of Business Administration (MBA) in five years.

- A. ATLANTIC CAPE students entering this program would be expected to complete the first two years of the program through their Associate's degree.
- B. Applicable courses transferred to STOCKTON, and outlined for each Business degree subfield below (in place at the time of this addendum signing), would enable students to complete years three through five of the program at STOCKTON. Curricula at both institutions are subject to change and students should consult with academic advisors before and during their progress through the Dual Degree program.
- C. Students can complete their undergraduate degree by the end of their fourth year, and their MBA degree by the end of their fifth year.

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- D. Admission to the Dual Degree program requires a 3.4 GPA or higher at the time of matriculation to STOCKTON.
- E. After matriculation, students would be required to maintain a 3.5 GPA or higher to remain in the program. This is consistent with the GPA requirement currently in place for STOCKTON undergraduate students admitted into the Dual Degree Program.
- F. In addition to requirements of the major and concentration, students must complete certain designated University At-Some-Distance and General Studies course requirements, writing (W1 and/or W2) requirements, quantitative reasoning (Q1 and/or Q2) requirements, race and racism (R1 and/or R2) education requirements, as well as the arts (A), historical consciousness (H), international/multicultural (I) and values/ethics (V) requirements. See: www.stockton.edu for complete descriptions of these requirements. Most of these requirements can be completed in all or in part with transfer courses.

III. Reverse Transfer

- A. As with the extant Transfer Pathways MOU, students entering the Dual Degree program who complete at least 30 credits at ATLANTIC CAPE, and successfully complete a cumulative total of 60 credits earned between their county college and a four-year institution, may be awarded an associate degree retroactively in accordance with the "Comprehensive State-Wide Transfer Agreement," a process known as reverse transfer.
- B. To actively encourage students to apply for reverse transfer, STOCKTON agrees to: 1) provide information to incoming transfer students about the reverse transfer process; 2) notify students of their potential eligibility when they achieve 60 credits. In addition, ATLANTIC CAPE agrees to waive any degree audit or graduation fees as an incentive for application.
- C. STOCKTON and ATLANTIC CAPE further agree to co-host reverse transfer information sessions for transfer students.

IV. Program Curriculum

- A. STOCKTON offers the following Dual Degree options:
 - 1. Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Business Studies with a concentration in:
 - Accounting
 - Business Analytics
 - Finance
 - Financial Planning
 - Management
 - Marketing
 - 2. Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in Business Studies
- B. The following table outlines the core courses of the Dual Degree program, the ATLANTIC CAPE course equivalents to STOCKTON courses within this program, and the recommended year of completion:

- C. In addition, the following ATLANTIC CAPE courses, BUSN 101: Introduction to Business, BUSN 210: Business Law, and BUSN 290: Practicum in Business Administration, can be applied as program courses in all STOCKTON business program concentrations.
- D. ATLANTIC CAPE course BUSN 211: Business Law II can be applied as an upper-level program elective in all program concentrations except Accounting and Business Analytics.
- E. Additional courses completed at ATLANTIC CAPE will be considered as cognate or At-Some-Distance degree requirements at STOCKTON.
- F. All students will need to complete the requisite STOCKTON General Studies degree requirements in place at the time of their matriculation.
