

Stockton Faculty Chosen as 2016/17 Fellows: SCOSA's Two New Collaborators

Recently Stockton's interim provost and executive vice president Susan Davenport announced the selection of fourteen faculty fellows to serve in various Stockton centers, institutes, and schools working on priority projects identified by the directors or deans of each unit. Each faculty fellow receives release from one course or overload pay equivalent to one course. SCOSA's new fellows are Dr. Dan Hernandez, associate professor of biology, and Dr. Diane Holtzman, associate professor of business, marketing.



Hernandez will conduct a project titled "STEMing Aging" that will involve students and faculty from Science, Technology, Engineering and Math programs at Stockton in developing various projects with SCOSA's older adult participants. An initial project will begin in Spring 2016 with the assistance of Stockton's Office of Service Learning where students in Hernandez's upper-level Ornithology class will offer regular birding opportunities for older adults. As the project expands during the 2016/17 academic year it may involve intergenerational projects empowering students and older adults to

become advocates for environmental sustainability and to address climate change.



Holtzman will assist SCOSA in better developing and clarifying its brand-identity and marketing strategies, particularly for members of the baby-boom generation and the middle-aged cohort. She will involve students from her Masters in Business Administration Advanced Marketing Strategies. This project is well-timed as SCOSA implements recommendations from the recently completed 5-Year Self-Study of the center.


