## UNDERSTANDING YOUR BILL

Student bills can be viewed in the Bursar's tab under My Account/My Bill link in the goStockton portal. Your bill will include all charges, including tuition, fees, housing, meal plan or other fees, as well as any financial aid you have accepted. These charges are posted to your account as they occur.

The Statement of Account allows students to view a full billing history for the entire time they were enrolled.

Use our **Bill Estimator** to calculate your estimated costs per semester.



## TUITION & FEES

Stockton University has flat rate tuition, which means undergraduate students taking between 12 and 20 credits in the Fall or Spring term are charged the same, flat rate. Part-time students or students registered for more than 20 credits per term are charged the per-credit rate based on residency. A breakdown of tuition & fees is available on the Bursar's website.

## HOUSING

New and returning students living on campus must submit the appropriate online housing application in the Student Life tab in the goStockton portal. A housing deposit is required at the time of application to hold your reservation. Housing deposits can be submitted online using the Make a Deposit link in the Bursar's tab in the goStockton portal.

## MEAL PLANS

No matter your dining needs or lifestyle, Stockton has a meal plan for you! Holding a meal plan is your ticket to easily enjoy all that campus dining has to offer. Pay attention to meal plan cancellation or change deadlines, included in the Important Dates section of the Bursar's website.

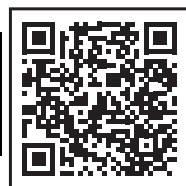
## PAYMENT OPTIONS

Payments can be made in person, by mail, online or via wire transfer.

## PAYMENT PLANS

Students may enroll in an interest-free payment plan and make installment payments rather than paying the total amount due in one payment. There is a non-refundable enrollment fee to enroll in a payment plan. Fall and Spring term payment options include 2, 3, 4, and 5 payment plans.

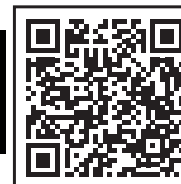
## IMPORTANT DATES

The Bursar's website includes a calendar of important dates, including payment due dates and other deadlines. Be sure to familiarize yourself with these dates to avoid late payment fees.

## OSPREY CARD

In addition to serving as your official Stockton identification card, your ID Card (Osprey Card) can also be used as a key card to enter buildings, rooms, library, athletics and events. The card also holds your meal plan and can act as a declining balance account, similar to a pre-paid credit card, to make purchases on campus and at participating off-campus locations.

Add funds, track your spending and see where the **Osprey Card** is accepted.



## FINANCIAL AID

Completing the **FAFSA** is the most important step for anyone applying for financial aid. Students pursuing a degree are encouraged to file the FAFSA at [fafsa.gov](https://fafsa.gov) and view their eligibility for state aid on [njfams.hesaa.org](https://njfams.hesaa.org) to be considered for all types of federal, state and institutional financial aid.

## THE STOCKTON PROMISE

The Stockton Promise grant will cover the remaining balance of your tuition & fees after all scholarships and federal & state grants are applied for qualifying students.
