From the Director's Chair

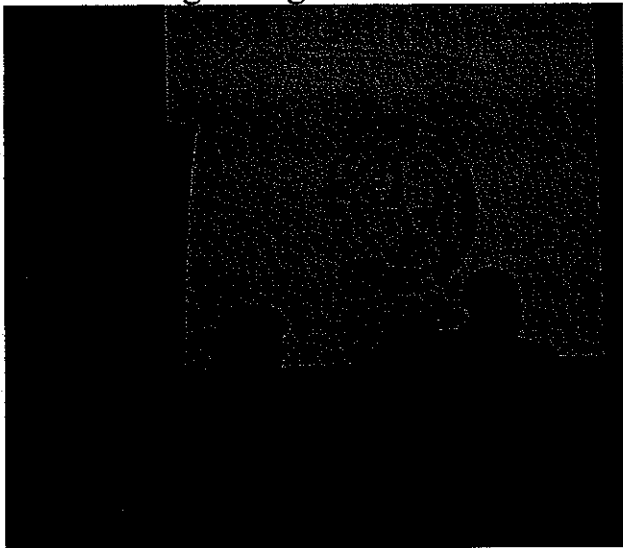

Our first Business Dean, Jenny Wagner (Check the Profile inside this issue) has been here for an academic year, and we will be adding our first new faculty member since 2005.

Our events this year have been just as fast and furious as every other; however we are really building an impressive alumni group with a cadre of unique

positions throughout the hospitality industry. Meanwhile, our faculty and current student body have been busy as well.

Since the last issue Dr Donna Albano has held our fourth annual Eta Sigma Delta (ESD) Induction. ESD is the International honor society for Hospitality and Tourism. Brian finished up his semester with a presentation to the Association of NJ County Cultural and Historic Agencies on behalf of the NJ Tourism Task Force.

We also all attended the Atlantic City Hotel and Lodging Association Scholarship Luncheon, held this year in The Tropicana Hotel and Casino where we had 5 Stockton Hospitality students receiving scholarships from that group. In a show of support, President Saatkamp, Provost Carr, Chief Development Officer Marilyn DiGiacobbe, and Dean of Business Janet Wagner were in attendance for that scholarship event. In April as well, I covered the Atlantic Cape May Workforce Investment Board (WIB) Conference as a facilitator for a session with the hospitality and tourism professionals in attendance on The Economic Forecast for the Southern NJ Hospitality and Tourism Industry. 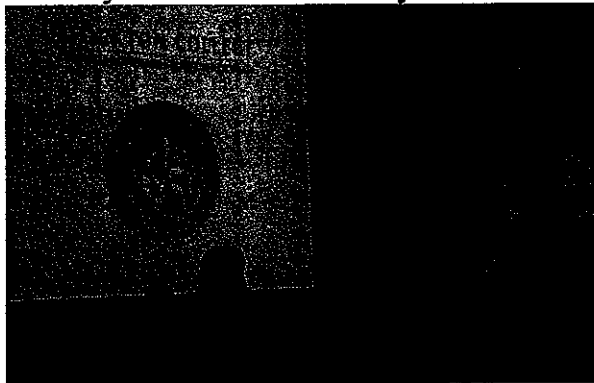

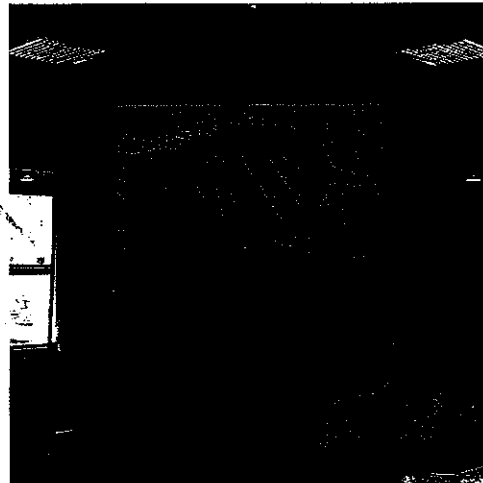

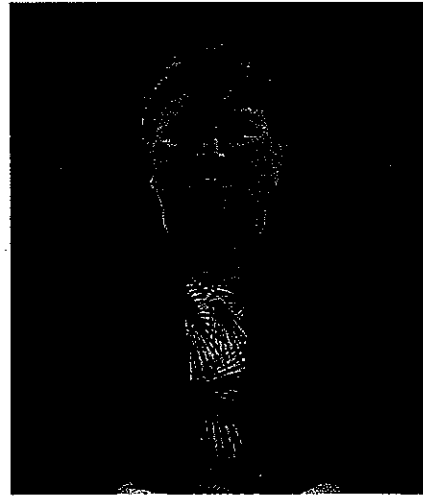
