Family Success Centers' caring and committed staff treat all people with respect and dignity as well as see the strength and potential in everyone.

Family Success Centers break away from traditional targeted, time constrained, casualty based interventions and use a strength-based approach of organizing resources to support the growth and development of families.

QUICK FACTS ABOUT NJ FAMILY SUCCESS CENTERS

- Family Success Centers (FSCs) focus on providing free and voluntary primary child abuse prevention resources to families through workshops, activities, groups and linkages to services.
- FSC network provide a two generation approach to serving families.
- In 2007, New Jersey became the first and only government to institute a statewide network of
 <u>Family Success Centers</u>, there are currently at least one FSC in each county.
