

#### LEADERSHIP EDUCATION AWARENESS DEVELOPMENT CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

Student involvement in academic and co-curricular activities is an essential part of today's educational experience. By completing a combination of the various academic courses, programs and co-curricular experiences listed herein, students will receive an official Leadership Education Awareness Development (L.E.A.D) certification through the Office of the Dean of Students. To achieve certification, 100 points must be earned, with the minimum number from each tier being accumulated. Transfer students may use their previous courses and experiences to meet up to 50 points toward the certification. All candidates must be graduating seniors (96 credits earned) with a minimum of 3.25 cumulative GPA and must have no previous social or housing probation.
