CHEMISTRY CERTIFICATION (K-12)

While all bachelor programs require a minimum of 128 credits and a 2.00 cumulative GPA, the NJ Department of Education requires a 3.0 cumulative GPA to be certified. Students in this concentration must complete a CHEM major with accompanying EDUC courses as shown. A Math SAT score of 550 or better is required to declare CHEM as a major. To earn a certification in chemistry, a student must complete 30 credits in chemistry with 12 at the upper level. A student should seek guidance on course choices to ensure they count towards certification. A grade of "C" or better is required in all content courses and a B- or better in professional education courses. High school coursework in math and science is recommended. Consult with the EDUC Program for application and licensure requirements. "The student is responsible for ensuring that all graduation requirements are met" (Bulletin). **Consult with your preceptors (EDUC & CHEM) on a regular basis.**
