If you haven't stopped by the newly renovated Upper J Wing to see our School of Education, you are in for a treat!

State-of-the-art classrooms with Epson Brightlink, Dell laptops, integrated PRS (clickers) and flexible furniture in J202; that same furniture, a SmartBoard with PRS (clickers) and iPads in J228.

Both rooms will also be Teachscape-enabled with mounted video cameras and video servers for our teacher candidates to reflect on their practice lessons.

Between the classrooms are Nancy Fiedler's office of Admissions and Advising, a smart conference room with LCD panel display, and a suite of administrative offices, including your mailboxes, Xerox and supplies to round out the wing.

Computer Services will be offering professional development on the tools themselves, and Dr. Doug Harvey of our own MAIT faculty will be offering more professional development based on pedagogical use of the tools. Contact

Freshmen Pilot: Teacher Ed

Prompted by TEDU program meeting conversations about declining post-baccalaureate enrollments, Coordinator Boakes has been working with Program Coordinators and Deans in other Schools to pilot degree programs that accept TEDU credits as both, Cognates and At-Some-Distance. Collaborating with Admissions, we invited some

50 well-qualified freshmen (entering with Praxis-exempt SAT scores) to pilot these curricular paths.

Please give your support to this pilot program by talking with your colleagues in other Schools about the benefits to teacher candidates who can complete their degrees in 128 (rather than 160) credits.

All non-pilot New Jersey districts must meet the following milestones in the 2012-13 school year:

1. Form a District Evaluation Advisory Committee (DEAC) to ensure stakeholder engagement by October 31, 2012.
2. Adopt educator evalua-

- tion rubrics that include state-approved teacher and principal practice evaluation instruments by December 31, 2012.
3. Begin to test and refine evaluation rubrics by January 31, 2013.
4. Form a School Improvement Panel to oversee

evaluation activities by February 1, 2013.

5. Thoroughly train teachers by July 1, 2013.
6. Thoroughly train evaluators by August 31, 2013.

In addition, districts must report on progress to the Department in February and August of 2013.

As noted in the previous story regarding EE4NJ, districts throughout the state will be deciding among the several approved models for teacher evaluation, or proposing one of their own.

Based on the adoptions in many of our partner and neighboring school districts, the School of Education has

adopted the Danielson Framework for our pre-service TEDU program.

Program Coordinator Dr. Norma Boakes, Assistant Dean Dr. Pam Vaughan, and MAED Director Dr. Kim Lebak have been presenting professional development workshops on this framework throughout the spring and summer. In

addition, the SRI & ETTC has several additional classes planned, and as always, remains available for custom training and consultations to our consortium members, partner and neighbor schools as we make the transition.

The Framework for Teaching is a research-based set of components of instruction, aligned to the INTASC standards, and grounded in a constructivist view of learning and teaching.
