Synchronous online administration improves response rate and provides you with easily readable open response comments in your summary report.

Dear Friends of our School,

So much is changing in our education profession that it often seems overwhelming: transition to Common Core Curriculum Standards, including the new **PARCC** assessments; the TeachNJ law and all of the new performance review systems; and right along with all of that change, a new accreditation agency that combines NCATE and TEAC into CAEP to set standards for educator preparation programs. Additional changes on the higher education landscape include new DoE waivers for the "12 -hour rule" that will allow some colleges to experiment with **competencybased**, rather than "seat time" measures of compliance. Watch this newsletter for more updates.

Our TEAC national accreditation review team was on campus March 5-7. To a person, the team members were impressed with the high quality, professionalism and preparedness of our students, our faculty, our alumni, our cooperating teachers, our supervisors and our staff. Thank you to everyone who has provided feedback in the open comment forum. We await our preliminary report in April and a panel in August.

As the spring term draws to a close, we are already preparing for a busy summer, when the School will be offering numerous courses on campus, online and in hybrid format. As always our SRI & ETTC will be bustling with activities and custom workshops.
