Co-Teaching Pilot: Early Signs of Success

Thanks to the collaboration of our TEDU Coordinator, **Dr. Norma Boakes, our** MAED Director, **Dr. Kim Lebak**, our Strategic Partnerships Specialist and 2012 New Jersey State Teacher of the Year, **Jeanne DelColle** and our Leadership Studies Mentor, **Dr. George Sharp**, Stockton has launched one of New Jersey's first co-teaching preservice pilot programs.

Differing from the typical "takeover model" where the student teacher gradually takes on full and sole responsibility for teaching over the course of a semester-long K-12 residency, the co-teaching model places the mentor teacher in partnership with the student teacher candidate. Together, the pair plan, deliver and assess instruction as a team.

Participants in the Stockton pilot program are simultaneously enrolled in a 3-credit graduate course that focuses on professionalizing the mentor relationship for teacher leaders who welcome a co-teacher into their classrooms for the semester.

One of the first teachers to sign up for the pilot is **Terry** Dougherty, Atlantic County's current Teacher of the Year and a distinguished graduate student in the MAED program. "I've always enjoyed mentoring student teachers. Co-teaching is the next natural evolution for the profession. Having Ms. Capille plan each day's lessons with me, sharing the instruction and working together to assess student learning has been a great experience thus far."

Student teaching candidate **Toni Capille** notes that "the semester is just flying by so quickly. There is so much to learn and I feel like I've had the chance to participate in so much more than if I were trying to do all of these experiences for the first time, by myself." Indeed, Ms. Capille volunteered with her mentor from the Roland Rogers Elementary School to assist other district volunteers with the region's annual Spelling Bee last weekend.

Early results of student learning in Terry's and other pilot program classrooms point to strong signs of improvement for those learners who began the experience below grade level.

"We can give more learners individual attention if we're both prepared to share the lessons each day. One of us continues to teach the whole group while the other can take time to work individually with a student," says Dougherty.
