

## NJDOE Update: PARCC Scores

As part of a comprehensive roll-out campaign, the New Jersev Department of Education held a press event at the New Jersey Manufacturers headquarters in Trenton on October 20 to release the first statewide PARCC results from the 2014-15 school year.

**Commissioner Hespe** and others at the press event noted challenges that lie ahead for New

Jersey educators, students and parents, and the potential for more specific district, school, and student level results to help inform instruction. Overall, fewer than 50% of all New Jersey test takers met or exceeded standards in English Language Arts and Math on most grade levels. Variations by grade level showed the poorest scores in 8th11th grade math, where no more than 36% of test takers met or exceeded grade-level standards.

NJEA officials were not at the press event, but released a statement that noted "a deeply flawed" tool and process.

The State Board will adopt "cut scores" at its November 4th meeting.

She received funding from the NJEA HIPP Foundation to offer dance classes and family fitness experiences with a focus on the school's Latino community. She has since received a continuation grant in the amount of \$10,000 to continue her popular fitness program, which now

includes a nutrition education component. Carlotta's engagement through her HIPP grant has allowed her to continue to develop as a professional. She is invited to speak at NJEA this November as a Great Ideas Forum Presenter and was recently a Donors Choose Grant Recipient. The Jackson, NJ resident received degrees in Literature and in Education from Stockton.
