RE: Procedure 2015 – Course Repeat (2<sup>nd</sup> reading)

Based on the first reading, the Senate Executive proposes two motions and a friendly amendment to streamline the discussion on Procedure 2015:

**Motion#1: Delete the following language from Procedure 2015**

“Students with upheld academic honesty violations per Procedure 2005 (Academic Honesty) may be prohibited from using grade replacement.”

If the Motion#1 fails, then the Executive makes a following friendly amendment to the language:

- 1) **Friendly Amendment:** Change current language “Students with upheld academic honesty violations may be prohibited from using grade replacement as detailed in Procedure 2005” to read as follows:

“Students with upheld academic honesty violations per Procedure 2005 (Academic Honesty) *in a given course* may be prohibited from using grade replacement *for said course*.”

**Motion#2: Change in the language from ‘maybe’ to ‘will be’**

“Students with upheld academic honesty violations, per Procedure 2005 (Academic Honesty) in a given course **will be** prohibited from using grade replacement for said course.”

**Motion#3: Change the language to exclude graduate students from grade replacement. New language would read:**

“Undergraduate students including dual degree programs may replace their grade in a maximum of five (5) courses, with all at the undergraduate level only
