## Message from Stockton UNIDOS: Latinos in Solidarity with BLM

## Colleagues/Colegas,

Two years ago, the UNIDOS organization was formed to bring together "La Comunidad" (community) at Stockton University and lead efforts to expand cultural and historical awareness of the contributions the Latino/a and Hispanic community. In those short two years, we hosted close to 100 events which sought to bring awareness and unity amongst Hispanic, Latin, immigrant, and the African American communities.



Afro-Latinidad is an integral part of our Latin identity as well as who we are as an organization as history teaches us that more slaves were sent to Latin American than the U.S. during the American slave trade.
