As we commemorate *Kristallnacht*, and consider the origins of the Holocaust, it is important to cast our eyes backwards to the first genocide of the 20th century, committed by German imperialists in their African colony. Though this genocide is little known, historians have begun to make significant links between the ideology and methodology used in Africa and the Nazi Holocaust just thirty years later. This talk will be accompanied by images of the genocide of the Herero and Nama people as well as examples of texts about the genocide from that era.
