**Who:** Students, including Political Science students and student veterans, faculty and staff will have the opportunity to interact with retired Congressmen Louis Frey of Florida, a Republican, and Robert Clement of Tennessee, a Democrat, over two days next week.

Frey was considered a moderate Republican leader who worked across the aisle when he served as the representative from Florida's 5<sup>th</sup> District from 1969-72 and Florida's 9<sup>th</sup> District from 1973-78. He established The Louis Frey Institute of Politics & Government in 2008 at the University of Central Florida.

Clement, who served in Tennessee's 5<sup>th</sup> Congressional District from 1987-2002, was considered a centrist Democrat. He was among the 81 House Democrats who voted in favor of authorizing the invasion of Iraq.

**What:** The William J. Hughes Center for Public Policy at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey's Congress to Campus event is part of a program of the Stennis Center for Public Service Leadership of Washington, aimed at allowing college students across the United States to interact with former members of Congress. The program sends bipartisan pairs of former congressmen to campuses to speak in classes and forums and to encourage students to become active in civic and political life.
