Galloway Township, NJ- The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey’s chapter of NJ Community Water Watch and Stockton Action Volunteers for the Environment (SAVE) will co-host the 8th Annual Environmental Education Forum at the College on Saturday April 18, 2009, from 9:00 am - 4:00 pm.

This year’s theme is “Sustainable is Attainable.” Stockton professors and community leaders will present workshops on alternative energy, nitrogen pollution, organic farming, water recycling, global warming, stormwater, student leadership, and the importance of the Pinelands for which optional nature walks and bike rides will also be offered. The day will also feature vendors, information tables, a panel discussion from Stockton Alumni, and a keynote address from Paul Loeb. Loeb, a motivational speaker and bestselling author of “The Impossible Will Take Awhile” and “Soul of a Citizen: Living with Conviction in a Cynical Time,” will provide unique insights into the process of change.

Tickets, are priced at \$5 and include breakfast and lunch. One dollar from each ticket sale will benefit Darfur relief efforts.

More than 200 students and community members from across New Jersey are expected to attend this event. Presenters include representatives from Clean Ocean Action, Save Barnegat Bay, Atlantic County Utilities Authority, Atlantic Audubon Society, United Unitarian Center, Galloway Green Committee, Hammonton Green Committee, South Jersey Fair Trade Alliance, Brite Idea Energy, Stockton professors Tait Chirenje, Patrick Hossay, Michael Geller, and Linda Smith, as well as Stockton students.
