Galloway Twp., NJ – In 1971, an antiwar group in Camden, NJ plotted to break into a draft-board office and wipe out government records. On Tuesday, September 25 from 4:30pm to 6:30pm, a film screening of *The Camden 28* will be shown in the Alton Auditorium of the Galloway Township campus, followed by a panel discussion led by Stockton Professor of Paul Lyons.

This documentary film tells the group's story together with the criminal trial that followed when they were caught by the F.B.I. *The Camden 28*, followed by a panel discussion will include a few of the members of the Camden 28. The Camden 28 were exonerated by a jury, in part because the defense persuasively argued that the FBI played a decisive role in planning the break-in, a form of entrapment. The documentary of the Camden 28 aired on PBS.
