**Galloway Township, NJ** - Stockton University's Manahawkin Instructional Site will host a Lunch & Learn lecture, "The Persecution of the Disabled in the Holocaust," on **Tuesday, May 12**.

Lillian Hussong, an adjunct professor of Stockton University School of General Studies, presents a lecture about the perceptions of the disabled in pre-Nazi Germany, the laws that discriminated against them as the Nazis rose to power, and the state-sponsored extermination of the disabled known as Aktion T-4, where the gas chamber was first used.

The event, which includes lunch, is free and open to the public. This is the continuation of a Lunch & Learn series that Hussong is facilitating to educate the community on the Holocaust. The first presentation, "Persecution of the Gypsies in the Holocaust," was offered to a full house.
