

Stockton Center on Successful Aging Sets 2015 Festival for May 13, Helping Seniors Take Charge

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Galloway Township, **NJ** – The Stockton Center on Successful Aging (SCOSA) is holding its annual Aging Successfully Festival from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on **Wednesday**, **May 13** in the Campus Center at Stockton University, located on 101 Vera King Farris Drive in Galloway.

The daylong event celebrates Older Americans Month and the 50th Anniversary of the Older Americans Act. This year's theme is "Get into the Act," focusing on how older adults are taking charge of their health, getting engaged in their communities, and making a positive impact in the lives of others.

Last year's event drew over 500 older adults who attended lectures, workshops, musical presentations and visited over 30 businesses and organizations exhibiting throughout the day.

Admission is free, parking is ample steps away from the building and the Campus Center is on NJ's transit 508 bus line serving Atlantic City and Hamilton Mall.
