**Galloway Township, NJ-** Colonel Jack Jacobs, who served two tours of duty in Vietnam, and is among the most highly decorated soldiers from that era, will deliver a free lecture at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey. The talk is scheduled for April 6, 2011, 3 p.m. in room 102 of the Arts and Sciences Building on the campus here. This presentation is free and open to the public.

Colonel Jacobs was a platoon leader in the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division, executive officer of infantry battalion in the 7<sup>th</sup> infantry division, and commanded the 4<sup>th</sup> Battalion 10<sup>th</sup> Infantry in Panama.

Colonel Jacobs, who began his military career when he entered the U.S. Army in 1966, was awarded three Bronze Stars, two Silver Stars and the Medal of Honor, the nation's highest combat decoration. He is vice chairman of the Congressional Medal of Honor Foundation and Holds the McDermott Chair of Humanities and Public Affairs at the United States Military Academy.

Author of the memoir, *If Not Now, When*, Col. Jacobs book received the 2010 Colby Award that recognizes the first work of fiction or non-fiction that has made a major contribution to the understanding of military history, intelligence operations and international affairs.
