Galloway Township, NJ- The late W. Cary Edwards was honored last night as the first recipient of the William J. Hughes Center for Public Policy's first Civility in Government and Politics Award. The event, held in the new Campus Center at Stockton, drew over 150 people.

Mr. Edwards, former member of the New Jersey General Assembly, Chief Counsel to Governor Thomas H.
