Joe'l Ludovich, Mike Zubrzycki Win Telly Award

Joe'l Ludovich, associate professor of Communications, and Mike Zubrzycki, liaison for the TV Studio and Academic Support, and a team of students and production professionals won a bronze <u>Telly Award</u> for their film production of "Michele Balan: Live at the Rrazz Room in Philadelphia."

Balan, a friend of Ludovich and a former contestant on NBC's Last Comic Standing, performed in front of a live audience, which "required planning, coordination and precise execution," according to the duo.

"I thought it was a great opportunity to bring students and professionals together to film in a challenging environment with a live audience," said Ludovich. "We only had one night to film the show, and you have to work with the venue and be respectful of the audience, because they paid good money to see the show. You have to carry yourself in a certain way, and I think it's important for students to experience that. You have to be there, but not be there."

"Exactly, you're invisible," added Zubrzycki, a '14 alumnus who said winning a Telly Award is a "great acknowledgment of professional achievement." He explained that each client has a different approach and personality, stating that production work is "never cookie cutter."

This was the first collaboration between Ludovich and Zubrzycki, and the two plan to collaborate again in the future, offering students another opportunity for involvement in a professional project.

Joe Dare has joined Stockton as the new head women's cross country and assistant track & field coach. Dare takes over the women's cross country program from Ashley Parker, who remains on the staff as an assistant coach for the cross country and track & field programs, relinquished the head coaching duties in order to spend more time with her family.

Dare arrives at Stockton after three years at the helm of the men's and women's cross country teams at Cabrini University. Last year, he coached the Cavalier men's team to its best finish at the Colonial States Athletic Conference Championship since 2008, guiding them to fourth place.

Dare's women's squad won the Penn State Brandywine Invitational twice and his runners earned CSAC all-conference honors twice during his tenure. Dare also coached at two Division I institutions. He was a volunteer assistant for track and cross country at Saint Joseph's University from 2012-14 and assistant coach at LaSalle University for the 2008-09 academic year.

Stockton University Remembers New Jersey Senator Jim Whelan

Stockton University remembers State Sen. Jim Whelan's many contributions to the region and the University. Whelan, a tireless advocate and champion of Stockton, passed away Aug. 22.

"It is with extraordinary sadness and a very heavy heart that I inform the Stockton community that Senator Jim Whelan passed away today," wrote President Harvey Kesselman in an email to faculty, staff and friends of the University. "I just spoke with him two days ago, and am heartbroken. Fortunately, our collective memory of him was during our first Commencement at Boardwalk Hall in May."

Several members of the Stockton community replied to Kesselman's email to express their sorrow, admiration and personal memories of Whelan, D-2nd, who served as Atlantic City's mayor from 1990-2001, and as a city councilman for the eight years prior.

Donnetrice Allison Presents at Conference in Cape Town, S. Africa

Donnetrice Allison, associate professor and coordinator of Africana Studies and associate professor of Communication Studies, presented at the <u>Association of Black Sexologists and Clinicians</u>' 2017 International Lecture Series, which was held August 2-5 in Cape Town, South Africa.

The conference included presentations on health disparities, mental health, social justice, and a variety of cross cultural issues that affect persons of African descent.

Allison's presentation was titled, "From Sapphires and Brutal Bucks to Thots and Thugs: The Long-lasting Legacy and Impact of American Media Stereotypes of Blacks."

"My presentation focused on the potential effects of negative eive them and on the way they perceive themselves." Allison ex-

portrayals of African Americans on the way others perceive them and on the way they perceive themselves," Allison explained. "I also spoke on the international implications. For instance, many South Africans perceive African Americans to be similar in behavior to those they see in music videos and on reality television shows."

Two Stockton University faculty members discussed the growth and future of beverage tourism at a seminar on Aug. 22 hosted by <u>Little Water Distillery</u> in Atlantic City.

Donna Albano, associate professor of Hospitality, Tourism & Management Studies, and Christina T. Cavaliere, assistant professor of Hospitality & Tourism Management and Sustainability, specifically covered New Jersey craft distilleries.

Cavaliere edited a two-volume text book, "Beers, Ciders & Spirits: Craft Beverages and Tourism in the U.S." She and Albano also contributed a chapter on N.J. craft distilleries.

"We [were] excited to discuss the release of the two volume text book that takes a comprehensive look at the emerging tourism market for craft beverages," Albano said.
