- Spring semester Course Release. Project MUST fall within January 1st and June 1th, 2015.
- 4 courses are available for award.
- <u>Guidelines</u> are available on the Grants Office website and <u>applications</u> are due no later than 5:00pm, September 15, 2014.

Provost Faculty Opportunities Fund –

- To support Stockton 2020 themes. Fall semester only – event occurring during October – mid-January 2015.
- <u>Guidelines</u> are available on the Grants Office website and <u>applications</u> are due no later than 5:00pm, September 15, 2014.

Sabbatical Leave -

- Support for a substantial Project that will result in advancing scholarship with tangible outcomes.
- 18 Semesters available, 1 Semester average award.
- Guidelines are available on the Grants Office website and applications are due no later than 5:00pm, October 15, 2014 for Fiscal Year 16 (7/1/15 – 6/30/16).

Annual Reports Due

Annual Reports for R&PD, CDC, Sabbatical, and Academic Advising Internal Awards are due October 15, 2014.

Please complete an "Annual Report" form for each award you received for FY 2014, and any outstanding reports for prior years.

Completed reports should be e-mailed to the Grants Office, as well as sent to Provost Kesselman and your Dean or Supervisor.

All annual reports must be up to date in order to be considered for any additional internal award funding.

GRC Faculty Alert

Finding funding just became easier!! The Faculty Alert System is an automated, monthly e-mail system containing funding opportunities tailored to each faculty member's specific needs. The alerts may include federal and private funding opportunities, with application deadlines extending out three months. As faculty needs will continually change, participants have the ability to alter their criteria at anytime.

To participate, simply complete a Faculty Alert System Application and return it to grants@stockton.edu. Because of a new filing system at the Grants Resource Center (GRC), applications will now be immediately put into the system and your funding opportunities alerts will begin without delay!
