Registration Notes and Definitions

- Most courses are on main campus, but there are some in Hammonton, Manahawkin and Atlantic City. Be sure to verify the campus location of each course.
- Sections <u>-091</u>, <u>-092</u>, <u>093</u>, etc. means <u>online component</u> course may be
 - Completely online
 - May be primarily online but meet one-three times for mandatory face-to-face sessions
 - May be partially online and meet for reduced times/days
- Be sure to click Submit once you have added a course to the registration queue. Your spot is not reserved until you do so, and the course could close while in your queue.
- Check your schedule to see if you are **Wait-Listed** on a course rather than Web Registered.
- **DON'T** sign up for a course today which seems similar to a course you have taken.
- Common Registration Errors:
 - Prerequisite/Test Score Error: Prior course requirements have not been met. For example,
 CRIM 1100 must be taken before CRIM 2114 or most other CRIM courses.
 - Open Reserved for Waitlist: There may be a spot available, but it is being held open for students on the waitlist.
 - Permission of Instructor/Permission of Department Required: You may need to contact the instructor or department (School) directly to request a permit.
- Check your Degree Works (degree evaluation) online to see what courses you need.
- Update your Degree Works after you register to see how your new courses meet requirements.
- Q1/Q2 (quantitative), W1/W2 (writing), A-Arts, H-Historical Consciousness, V-Values, I-International can also be met with At-Some-Distance courses (non-SOBL and Gxx) as well as program courses.
