

INFORMATION ABOUT SOBL MAJORS AND COURSE SELECTION (TRANSFERS)

CRIM (Criminal Justice)

- You must earn a C or higher in all CRIM courses (including transfer courses)
- CRIM 2145 Statistics, CRIM 2141 Research & Evaluation in CJ and CRIM 36xx Capstone must be taken at Stockton
- CRIM 3900 Internship is an elective (optional); CRIM 2141 must be completed as a prerequisite
- There are 8 core courses and 2 electives; all core courses must be completed prior to Capstone
- Let us know if you have applied and been accepted into the dual degree program

ECON (Economics)

- ECON 1200 (Intro to Macro) is a prerequisite for ECON 1400 (Intro to Micro); both are required
- Take two: ECON 3601 Intermediate Micro, ECON 3602 Intermediate Macro or ECON 3636 Political Economy and three electives: ECON 2xxx or 3xxx
- Take all three: ECON 3605 History of Economic Thought, ECON 3610 Intro to Econometrics and ECON 4695 Senior Seminar

GERO (Gerontology)

- Courses in the Gerontology minor (GERO) may count as a cognate course for any SOBL major
- Cognates are courses in social and behavioral sciences (SOBL) not in your major

POLS (Political Science)

- Required 3 core courses: POLS 2100 Intro to American Politics (by 2nd semester junior); take POLS 3150 Political Methodology semester prior to final semester POLS 4695 Senior Seminar
- Take 7 electives
- Consider POLS 3900 Internship or WASH 3940 internship in later semester

PSYC (Psychology)

- Required in person core courses: PSYC 1100 Intro to Psychology (can be transfer course or AP credit), PSYC 2241 Statistical Methods, PSYC 3242 Experimental Psychology and PSYC 36xx Senior Seminar (topics vary)
- Note that PSYC 2241 is a prerequisite to PSYC 3242 Experimental Psychology
- Three core electives: 1 natural science, 1 social science, 1 from either category
- Three electives – any PSYC course (note some course options may also be cross-listed)
- PSYC 3900 or GERO 3900 Internships are optional and may count as elective
- Note that PSYC has a B.A. and a B.S. option

SOCY (Sociology)/ANTH (Anthropology)

- Take SOCY 1100 (Intro to Sociology) or ANTH 1100 (Intro to Anthropology)
- Consider taking both (only one required, but a second can be used as a program elective)
- Five electives – any SOCY or ANTH course
- Junior – Fall: SOCY 3642 Social Research Methods; Spring: ANTH 3643 Anthropological Field Methods
- Senior – Fall: SOCY/ANTH 3681 Social Theory; Spring: SOCY/ANTH 4685 Senior Seminar

SOWK (Social Work)

- First Year/Sophomore (any order, complete before junior year): SOWK 1101 Intro to Social Work, SOWK 1103 Human Behavior/Social Environment and SOWK 2504 Race, Ethnicity, Diversity
- Junior – Fall: SOWK 3101 History of Social Welfare Policy and SOWK 3604 Theory and Methods I
- Junior – Spring: SOWK 3604 Theory and Methods II, SOWK 3905 Practicum Fieldwork, and SOWK 3102 Research Methods in Social Work
- Senior – Fall: SOWK 4601 Seminar: Social Work Practice I, SOWK 4901 Fieldwork I
- Senior – Spring: SOWK 4602 Seminar: Social Work Practice II, SOWK 4902 Fieldwork II
- One introductory course in Political Science and in Economics, PSYC 1100 Introduction to Psychology and PSYC 2211 Abnormal or PSYC 3302 Personality
- Human Biology requirement (could be GIS, GSS, PSYC, HLTH, BIOL, GERO among others)

General Studies – 25% of Stockton courses (GAH, GNM, GSS, GEN, GIS)

- Transferring in less than 64 credits (no Associate's degree)?
2 GAH, 2 GNM, 2 GSS, 1 GEN, 1 GIS (some of these will have transferred in)
- Transferring in 64 and/or Associate's degree?
3 Gxx (GAH, GNM, GSS, GEN, GIS) **AND** 1 GIS
- Transferring in more than 64 credits?
1 to 3 Gxx required, depending on credits (GAH, GNM, GSS, GEN, GIS) **AND** 1 GIS

Consider taking a Transfer Seminar in Fall '20

- Transfer Seminars are program or general studies courses only open to transfers
- Transfer Seminars are not required but credits and course content will count towards graduation
- Transfer Seminars are an opportunity to meet other transfers and participate in class activities designed specifically with transfers in mind

Missing AP or other transfer credit?

- Check with us if you may have missing AP credit or missing transfer credits; we want to be sure you do not inadvertently take a course for which you already have credit OR you are unable to take a course because the prerequisite course credit is missing
