## Please provide a summary of the project and your experience.

The goal was to create global opportunities for Stockton by initiating an MOU with UTFSM in Chile. This had three activities.

First, presenting, then publishing, internationally collaborative research (wine sustainability data from NJ & Santiago region of Chile) with colleague from partner University (UTSM - Chile), at an internationally recognized academic meeting (Association of Wine Economists – Padua, Italy).

Second, I invited Dr. Lionel Valenzuela from UTFSM to Stockton as a guest lecturer. He presented on economic and environmental issues in Chile (mining, fisheries, wine) at Stockton.

Third, I have gone to Chile to develop a student study tour, short term study abroad. The course will run Fall 2020.

In addition, this funding received considerable matching funds from UTFSM.

- First, conference presentation at an international conference with subsequent publication of research in peer review journal (ideally Journal of Wine Economics or Society & Natural Resources). Also, it allows the opportunity to network and collaborate with other foreign scholars, apply for grants within the wine industry, and develop other MOUs with other universities around the world. Success will be measured by presentation of research and publication of research paper.
- 2) Allowing students, faculty and community to learn about interdisciplinary research from a scholar from South American and further globalize our campus. Success will be measured by number of students/faculty/staff attending the lectures and the publication of the visit in local papers, Stockton Times and maybe Presidents report. Ideally this will begin the exchange of lecturers between Stockton and UTSM more regularly.
- 3) Develop another short-term international opportunity for students to study abroad. The course will be interdisciplinary, and collaborative between Stockton and UTSM. Many students don't

have the money or time to study abroad for a semester or more – this short term opportunity can bolster Stockton's numbers of study abroad and globalize education for our generally regional students. Success measured by successful development of a field-study study abroad course.

1. Research was presented at two conferences

  - 2. Invitation was made and Dr. Valenzuela presented two lectures at Stockton University on April 24, 2018. Posters were made & distributed and turnout was good. He was able to leverage matching funds from his university for this visit. We paid for his flight only & I took him out to dinner a bunch of times on my own. An interview was even conducted by students in the language program.
