Please provide a narrative summary of your project.

The mission of the Dual Credit Program at Stockton University is to provide a community service to college-bound high school students, giving them a jump-start on college by providing the opportunity to earn college credits and complete high school course requirements simultaneously. It is Stockton University's mission through its partnership with high schools to help students prepare for success in college by exposing them to university level material and providing them the advantage of making progress toward a college degree in a timely and affordable way.

The Dual Credit Program has grown significantly in recent years. Our goal is to bring enrolled high school students to Stockton to meet with our faculty and learn more about their area of interest/ program. Many of our internal participating programs have requested information on how to do this and how to help recruit students. Our discussions have concluded that the students need to meet and experience a day with the program.

Our objective is to bring knowledge and hope to underrepresented areas (Atlantic City HS, Pleasantville HS, ACIT, Millville Senior HS, Eastern HS, etc) through introduction to the campus and interpersonal experience with their program of interest. We want to utilize this funding to bring the dual credit students and HS teachers for a day visit with the Stockton program. This will strengthen our ties with the community and our present partners. We would include as many partners as possible.

FUNDING:

TES – \$4,000 Proposed pay rate \$20 per hour

- Assist with organizing transportation, program schedule, coordination of events, greeting buses and escorting group to the Stockton program meeting point.
- Keep record of students/teachers that attend.
- Coordinate with high school administrators and Stockton programs.
- Order lunch coupons and distribute to group.
- Coordinate a time for Admissions to address the group and take on a campus tour.
- Ensure group is escorted back to bus for return trip.

TRANSPORTATION - \$5,000 - Multiple 1-day visits from various schools

- Bus costs vary depending on distance. At an average of \$250 per bus, we could accommodate 20 buses per year.
 - Trips would run between mid-October and mid-May
- High school classes average 20-30 students. We would invite the entire class (students not
 enrolled in DC will be included) and the teacher(s). Open discussion on inviting the parents if
 they can attend.
 - \circ 2 3 Stockton programs per trip = 60 90 students.
 - Schedule different high schools based on program and high school schedules.

GOALS

- Increase retention and awareness of the Stockton Dual Credit Program.

- Parents, students, high schools and teachers have all expressed interest in the students engaging personally with the program of their interest.
- This initiative will give the students more insight on the college experience and a personal feeling of meeting our faculty.
- We'd also like to suvey the parents on ideas and how we can help them.

CONVERSION

- We will keep track of the students who attend the events and monitor enrollment.
- Enrollment Management will have a part in the 1-day events to assist with monitoring attendance, conversion, etc.
- Below is the conversion goal set for AY24 and AY25:

Bringing the Dual Credit students to our campus will enlighten them on the Stockton promise of support, equity and inclusion. The Stockton program will have the time to educate the students on their academic program, timeline and curriculum, which will help market and build their program enrollment. We will continue to build the Stockton Dual Credit Program and work closely with new and present partners to manage enrollment, retention, GPAs, race, ethnicity and overall success.

Through new and innovative efforts the goal for the institution is the transition of a High School Dual Credit student to a Stockton student, building familiarity and relationships from early in their high school career.

My recent OMIC Summer Program, working with the various key areas on campus, taught me ways to dispel these ideas. There is a lot of support here at Stockton for the program!

 - o Continued increase in enrollment, credits, high schools each year

Finish Line:

Stockton University has set the standard for High School Dual Credit. Other institutions have reached out to ask about our process as our reputation has grown. New schools and courses are being added each year and strong relationships have been formed with admins and students/parents. We treat the dual credit student as if they were already a Stockton student. The goal is to transition our efforts to the bottom line. Increased conversion from high school to Stockton will be monitored to include successful program enrollment/retention. This will help us to focus efforts on continued success and make any adjustments necessary.
