"My son Luis Guillermo was kidnapped in 2013. My reaction was an unbearable pain and desperation, but at the same time I felt an overwhelming feeling of fearlessness and determination: I was going to search for him myself. Soon I met other moms whose children were missing too, and with them I founded the Colectivo Solecito de Veracruz. I went from searching for my missing son, to searching for a lot of missing people. There are 300 moms in the group, and we are determined to find each and everyone of our children."

Lucía de Los Ángeles Díaz Genao is one of the founders of "Colectivo Solecito de Veracruz," a grassroots group of mothers searching for their missing loved ones in Mexico's Gulf state of Veracruz, who the state has abducted and murdered in the course of its "war on crime" in the last 13 years.
