
The Nanticoke Lenni-Lenape Tribal Nation: Resilience and a Decolonial Future in Lenapehoking







Panelists Chief Mark "Quiet Halk" Gould, Artist Tyrese Gould Jacinto "Bright Flower," and Tyrone "Dancing Wolf" Ellis, the tribe's Annual Pow-Wow and Program Coordinator, will discuss how the resilience of the Nanticoke Lenni-Lenape Tribal Nation through centuries of settler-colonial and US state attempts to destroy them as a group informs their continued struggle to assert their sovereignty, adhere to their culture and teach it to their children and grandchildren, and protect the environment, their natural home for generations in Lenapehoking. In these and other ways, the Nanticoke Lenni-Lenape Tribal Nation charts a path for a decolonial future to the benefit of all who live here.
