Steve Phillips, Stockton Transfer Admissions representative, will be at the instructional site at 30 Front St. in downtown Hammonton to assist prospective students from 5-7 p.m. Prospective students should bring up-to-date college transcripts which will enable Phillips to provide an "instant decision" in most cases as to whether they are eligible for admission to Stockton.
